



Snippets from the classrooms

In Reception this week we have started our daily phonics lesson. We have learnt four new phonemes and have been busy collecting items that begin with the new sounds. We have been talking about what makes us feel happy and calm after reading the 'The Colour Monster' story. The Gazette photographer came in to take our class photo so we will look out for that in the newspaper as he said we will be famous!

This week in Year 2 we continued our Geography work about Antarctica. We compared Antarctica to the Sahara Desert and looked for similarities and differences.

Year 3 have had a wonderful fortnight with lots of new learning! In DT, we are enjoying finding out where our food is grown. We are gaining a greater understanding of the climate that different fruits and vegetables need to grow well. Thank you to parents for sending in packets and labels - they are forming an ever-growing display on our classroom wall beside our world map! In Music, we loved practicing our vocal scales for the first time this week. Our version of Space Oddity by David Bowie is coming on a treat!

Year 4 - We have had another brilliant week with the children all working so hard. We had our first dance lesson with 'Mini Moverz' this week to start getting us ready for taking part in the Dance Festival at Blackpool Opera House. Our Year 4 children also had their first swimming lesson at St Annes YMCA. They all behaved so well; they were even allowed some extra swimming time as they managed to get through their assessment so quickly. In RE we have been looking at our Christian Values and the children have been sharing challenges they have overcome and stories that inspire them.

This week in Year 5, we have been building news reports by interviewing witnesses, writing a full class transcript, and writing exciting news bulletins about Philippe Petit's courageous tightrope walk. In French, we constructed mashed up animals before forming descriptive sentences and funny new names for our concoctions. We have also conducted an experiment in Science, to test which everyday materials could be used to make a coffee cup.

Children return to school on Wednesday 1st November

Lancashire County Council's school admissions for children starting primary school or moving to secondary school in September 2024 opens on Friday 1 September 2023.

Parents can apply online at www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools - it's quick and easy!

The national closing dates for applications are:

- Tuesday 31 October 2023 for secondary applicants
- Monday 15 January 2024 for primary applicants.

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application.

You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.
