



Snippets from the classrooms

This week in nursery we have been strengthening our arm muscles! We have been busy baking leaf shaped biscuits and scooping out the insides of pumpkins. All of this work is going to help us become writers one day! We have also been learning the nursery rhymes 'A Sailor went to Sea' and 'Baa, Baa Black Sheep'.

We can't believe we have now completed our very first half term at school. Miss Harter and Miss Wilkinson are so proud of how hard we have worked especially with our phonics. We have loved spending time with our Year 6 buddy's, making new friends, thinking of ideas, being creative and becoming independent. It has gone very fast but we are ready for a rest as all that work has tired us out!

In Art, Year 1 have been doing some observational drawing using techniques they have learnt over recent weeks. They all enjoyed drawing pieces of fruit. Last Tuesday was World Mental Health Day, and to mark this, we took part in some relaxing yoga. They all loved listening to peaceful music, and trying different stretches.

In Y2, as part of our Science work this half term we have been learning about healthy eating. This week we designed and made healthy wraps. We thought carefully about what healthy ingredients we would use and we worked carefully to use equipment safely to chop, grate and slice the ingredients.

Year 3 have been busy practising all the French vocabulary they have been learning during this half term. The children are gaining the confidence to share their greetings and questions with their friends. The have made puppets and have used these to perform a French rhyme. The children have impressed us with their writing based on the book "The First Drawing." They have used a range of different sentence types and have been showing off their use of inverted commas to punctuate speech. Well done Year 3. Have a well-deserved rest over half term.

Year 4 are busy preparing for the Dance Festival which is taking place in November; there are a lot of moves to remember! They have also been creating some wax resistant art patterns and pictures.

Year 5 have been feeling creative this week and have been writing poems and raps about our school and school life. Mrs Wooldridge is loving the constant stream of visitors to her door clutching notebooks and reciting poems, songs and raps!

This week Y6 have finished working on the Topic of 'Evolution and Inheritance'. It was fantastic to look back and realise how much we have learnt. Similarly, we have completed the Geography Topic of 'Climate Change' but are looking forward to a Zoolab enrichment visit which will enhance our learning. What a busy half term it has been. We are certainly looking forward to the second half of the Autumn Term.

This week was our last week of league netball and football matches. The children have been fantastic! We are so proud of how the children have conducted themselves.

We are aiming to continue our netball and football practises throughout the whole of the Autumn and Spring term in preparation for the league starting up again in Spring term 2.

Winter Uniform - reminder

All children will be expected to return after the holidays wearing winter uniform.

The policy is on the website but the details of the uniform can be found below.

Uniform Requirements

- Dark green Jumper or Cardigan;
- White Shirt with school tie;
- Grey Trousers/Skirt or pinafore dresses;
- Grey socks, white socks or grey tights
- Flat black shoes with either Velcro or a buckle. Please avoid laces unless your child can tie these themselves.
- Dark green blazer (Y5 and Y6 children only)

PE Kit

All children should attend school in PE uniform on PE days. Your child will have the following options on the 2 days that they do PE to either:

- Wear the full tracksuit with school PE t-shirt.
- Wear the tracksuit top with school PE t-shirt and their own plain black jogging bottoms (no logos)

Trainers must be plain black or white with minimally sized logo (no neon colours)

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application.

You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.
