


Our School Disco was very well attended last night and thanks must go to all staff and PTFA members who helped to make this such a success. We'll let you know how much was raised in due course.

#### Snippets from the classrooms

This week we have been painting firework pictures in the style of Jackson Pollock! The children have loved flicking their paint brushes and being passionate painters!

We have all settled back into school really well in Reception and are excited for the busy half term ahead. We talked about safety instructions for bonfire night and how we can keep safe. In phonics we have been learning some new digraphs. A digraph is when two letters make one sound.

Year 1 have been learning about shapes in Maths. We have learnt the names of a variety of 2D and 3D shapes, and we have also identified what shapes a variety of real-life objects are. We have also begun our new unit of work in Design and Technology, which focuses on Mechanisms. In our first lesson, we explored sliders and movement. We used our new knowledge to make a rabbit in a hat!

Last week we found some footprints in Y2. We managed to identify four of them but we couldn't identify the fifth set. With the help of the Natural History Museum we have discovered that they were dodo footprints. We had lots of questions about dodos and we especially wanted to know why they had become extinct. Today we have done lots of research and we now are now dodo experts.

Year 3 have been writing "Revolting Recipes" inspired by the novel "The BFG" by Roald Dahl. We are creating our own Revolting Recipe book and the children have come up with some truly revolting ideas.

The children have enjoyed learning the names of the bones in a human skeleton and we played our own version of "head, shoulders knees and toes," to help us remember them.

Year 4 continue to prepare for the Dance Festival which is taking place on Monday; there are a lot of moves to remember!

This week Year five have worked very hard.

We have started our new story, The Odyssey. The children have been making predictions based what we have read so far and on the mythology knowledge some pupils have shared in our class.

The children practiced their Remembrance Worship patiently throughout the week and have been supportive of each other.

"I am incredibly proud of Year Five this week, especially because of how respectful they have been. I am really impressed with how well they all delivered the worship" - Miss Rothney

Y6 have had a busy week where we have revised what we know about electrical circuits and even made our own. We have also begun learning about The Shang Dynasty and are intrigued to know what that has to do with uncovered 'Dragon bones.' We created drawings of our peers from life and have been finding out about the music of WW1 and WW2! A very active and fun week indeed!

#### Books

#### **Uniform Requirements**

- Dark green Jumper or Cardigan;
- White Shirt with school tie;
- Grey Trousers/Skirt or pinafore dresses;
- Grey socks, white socks or grey tights
- Flat black shoes with either Velcro or a buckle. Please avoid laces unless your child can tie these themselves.
- Dark green blazer (Y5 and Y6 children only)

#### PE Kit

All children should attend school in PE uniform on PE days. Your child will have the following options on the 2 days that they do PE to either:

- Wear the full tracksuit with school PE t-shirt.
- Wear the tracksuit top with school PE t-shirt and their own plain black jogging bottoms (no logos)

Trainers must be plain black or white with minimally sized logo (no neon colours)
