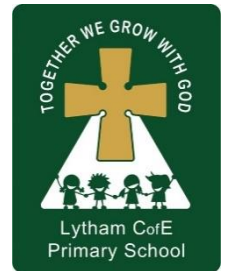

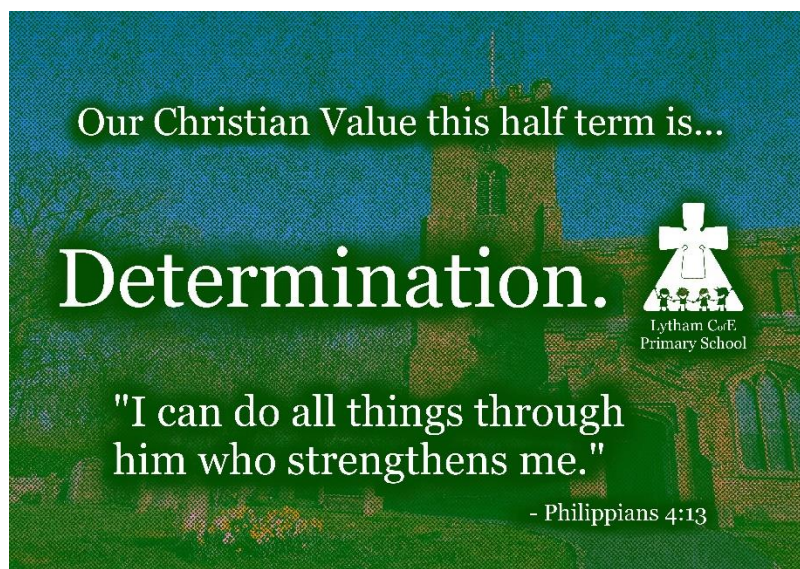

Snippets from the classrooms

This week, the nursery children had a visit from a Fire Engine! The children were super excited and not phased by the rain at all. The children got the chance to hold the hose and squirt the water as well as sitting inside the truck. We also had our first football session with AFC Fylde and the children were amazing! Their listening skills and physical skills were just brilliant!

Reception - In phonics this week we have been reading compound words and in Maths we have been experimenting with the balancing scales to understand 'heavier' and 'lighter'. This Thursday was very exciting as we had a visit from Eve and Chloe who came from Kenyon's Dental Surgery in Lytham. They came to talk to us about how to look after our teeth and how we need to brush them twice a day. After school we were very excited to be staying for 'Movie Night'.

Year 1 loved taking part in number day last week. It was great to see all of their outfits! We completed lots of fun activities, including a 'number hunt' around school. This week has been schools' football week, and we have enjoyed two sessions where we have been able to learn lots of new skills and have lots of fun. In art, we have all created a 'tree of life' using techniques that we have learnt this half term. Mr Gray, Mrs Reams and Mrs Norman are all very impressed!

This week in Year 2 we have completed our Geography work about farming. We investigated where different fruits were imported from. We enjoyed using the atlases and globes to locate the different countries. In Art we painted our clay pots and tiles and we are very proud of the finished results.

Year 3 have done a fantastic job of writing their newspaper reports about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. They really showed off their knowledge of the features of a report. We had great fun in Science when investigating different types of soil. We found quite a few live creatures and used good observation skills when working out what our soil samples were made up of.

We have had such a busy week in Year 4. The children were brilliantly behaved when we went to see The Lion King. Our biscuit project has also come to an end this week, with the children producing their final products to share with their visitors. The children worked on their market research, budgeting and packaging designs before producing their final biscuits (they were delicious). I am so proud of how hard all the children in Year 4 have worked this half term. We have managed to fit so much in and they have shown such determination towards their learning. Their sequels to 'Winter's Child' are amazing and we have them proudly displayed outside our classroom. Well done Year 4.

Year 5 have been Science Superstars!

In English, we have been reading about Curiosity - the Mars Rover, and discovering the journey it has taken from creation to exploration of The Red Planet. We have even listened to the story being read by astronaut Nick Hague from the International Space Station.

In Science, the children explored how long it takes different planets to orbit the Sun by conducting their own experiment, timing how long it takes them to 'orbit' each other at different distances.

In computing this half term, Year 5 have been fantastic at working with databases. They have built up skills each week by organising information, conducting database searches and ways to display their findings.

We have also been having fun in French, learning about shopping, using prior knowledge of numbers, days of the week and different foods.

Staffing Update

Following interviews held this week, the Governors have appointed Miss Hannah Davies as our new Deputy Headteacher. Miss Davies is currently Acting Deputy Headteacher at St Anthony's Catholic Primary School in Fulwood and she will formally take up her position at the start of the new academic year. She will be visiting school in the Summer term and I know that she will receive a warm welcome from all.

Also, you may have spotted that our lovely Mrs Allison is expecting a baby! We are all incredibly excited about this and look forward to meeting baby Allison in the latter part of the summer term.

The school gates are open from 8.45am to 8.55am. If a pupil arrives after the gate is locked they must sign in at the school office and will receive a late mark.

So far this academic year there are 57 pupils with late marks and a total of 192 lates recorded.
