

Snippets from the classrooms

The children have settled back into nursery life beautifully! It is as if we haven't had a half term! Last week, we had a surprise visit from a one week old baby lamb! The children were fascinated by her and were ever so kind and gentle.

Year 1 have been working so hard over the past two weeks. In maths we have been learning about length and height. We learnt the terms shorter and taller and then began using rulers. We measured lines, and also went around the classroom to find objects of specific lengths. We have started a new book in English called 'Stanley's Stick'. In one of our lessons, we had to imagine that we all had a magic stick. We then had to write what we would use our stick for. An example of one of the sentences we thought of was 'My stick is a magic pen, and I will use it to draw pictures that come to life'

In our English work in Year 2 we are really enjoying reading the book 'The Minpins' by Roald Dahl. We have loved the way the author uses language to create atmosphere and we are working hard to use adjectives and similes in our own writing. In our DT work we have been investigating different mechanisms and have been finding out about pivots and linkages. We are going to use what we have learnt to help us design and make a moving monster. We were very lucky this week to have a visitor in our classroom. Mrs Fenton came to talk to us about dairy farming which we had learnt about last half term in our Geography work.

Year 4 had such an exciting day when we went on our school trip last week. The children all engaged with the instructors and shared their own knowledge as well. The children have also enjoyed our new books in English and have done some very persuasive writing when they applied for the job of 'assistant baker'. We were also lucky enough to have a reading workshop this week with Lancashire Library. We have really enjoyed exploring the new books we have in school and have chosen some lovely texts for our classroom.

Year 5 have had a fantastic week!

We have started looking at a new book in English called The Whale. The children have really enjoyed using their inference skills and imagination, and even some drama activities to explore the story, as it only has pictures!

In Maths we have been exploring the link between fractions and decimals and in P.E. the children have been developing their tennis skills, particularly their forehand and backhand techniques.

I am so proud of their determination and hard work this week!

Year Six have been had quite a lot of SAT's practise this week, in which the children have been building stamina and showing that they are passionate about improving in all areas. Thankfully, we have also had time to enjoy all of our other subjects and are particularly enjoying looking at evidence to decide whether The Trojan horse and it's part in the seige of Troy was a real historical event, a myth, or a classical legend.
